ORDINANCE NO. 517-2009: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 492-2006: THE VILLAGE OF PANDORA, OHIO INCOME TAX REGULATIONS. Motion was made by Mrs. Stall, seconded by Mr. Blank to adopt Ordinance No. 517-2009 as read for its third and final reading. Voting: All Yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 518-2009: AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ADOPTING AND ENACTING AMERICAN LEGAL PUBLISHING'S OHIO BASIC CODE 2009 EDITION, AS THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF PANDORA, OHIO. Motion was made by Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Painter to place Ordinance No. 518-2009 on its first reading. Voting: All Yea.

Village Administrator reported on the following: 1) The bid documents for Phase IV sewer project stated the dirt to be hauled to the dirt mound on Basinger Road. Since this was not the preferred location, after some discussion, it was the consensus of the Council for the prospective bidders bid the hauling of the dirt two ways: one-the dirt pile on Basinger Road and the alternate bid-haul at a location outside the village. 2) Received letter from Ohio EPA as to the classification of the wastewater facilities. According to the Ohio EPA rules the village's wastewater/lagoon system is designed for 335,000 gallon per day capacity. As a result, the classification should be Class II, not Class I as it has been operating for a number of years. Poggemeyer Design Group was contacted as to this matter. There are three options to be in compliance: 1) for Marvin Steiner to take classes to be a Class II operator [presently he has a Class I license]. 2) Apply for a variance as to this classification and once the sewer project is completed, then go to a controlled discharge system. 3) Documentation to change the design to be in compliance for a Class I system. After some discussion it was the consensus of the Council to seek a variance and once the sewer project is completed go to a controlled discharge system.

The Village Administrator and the Fiscal Officer attended the Tax Incentive Review Council meeting on March 17, 2009 as to the CRA agreement with Pandora Grain. It was recommended by the Tax Incentive Review Council Board to have the CRA agreement with Pandora Grain to continue as is. Motion was made by Mr. Painter, seconded by Mrs. Stall to accept the Tax Incentive Review Council Board's decision for the CRA agreement with Pandora Grain to "continue as is". Voting: All Yea.

Discussion was had regarding if an employee desires to drop the group medical insurance through the village if there would be any type of reimbursement policy in lieu of the village paying the monthly premium through the village's group plan. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Council not to establish a reimbursement policy to any employee who desires to discontinue medical coverage through the village.

Motion was made by Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Fricke to excuse Mr. Vance from this meeting. Voting: All Yea.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Painter, seconded by Mr. Fricke. Voting: All Yea.
