ORDINANCE NO. 520-2009:

AN ORDINANCE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PANDORA, PUTNAM COUNTY, OHIO, ESTABLISHING AN IDENTITY THEFT PROGRAM AND INCLUDING THE PROGRAM IN THE VILLAGE'S PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL.
Motion was made by Mr. Painter, seconded by Mr. Vance to place Ordinance
No. 520-2009 on its first reading. Voting: All Yea.

Motion was made by Mrs. Stall, seconded by Mr. Blank to adopt "Identity Theft Prevention Policy" and be included in the Village's Personnel Policies and Procedure Manual. Voting: All Yea.

The Village Administrator reported on the following: 1) In light of the sewer project and the upcoming Festival, the preparation of a newsletter. A draft will be e-mailed to the council members prior to sending the same to the printers. 2) Phase IV Sewer Project will officially begin Wednesday, June 10th. The contractor's liability insurance, according to the bid documents, he submitted has expired as of May 22, 2009. Poggemeyer Design Group will be contacting the contractor to send his updated Certificate of Liability Insurance to the Village. 3) Received two quotes as to refuse haulers for the town-wide cleanup. The present hauler, Meyer Refuse, has sold to another individual. Ty Mayberry of M & M Hauling - \$475.00 per truck load which includes the landfill costs. Nathan Alt, dba Meyer Refuse - \$250.00 per truck load and he would submit the weight slips which would be an additional charge as well as landfill costs. It was the concensus of the Council to hire Nathan Alt, dba Meyer Refuse for the town-wide cleanup on June 19th.

Discussion was also had as to the Village having their own re-cycle program. There would be some significant costs involved. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to check other villages which have a contract with a refuse hauler for the whole town which includes a re-cycle program.

Motion was made by Mr. Vance, seconded by Mr. Painter to excuse Mr. Fricke from this meeting. Voting: All Yea.

Police Chief Stant reported on the costs involved in establishing a Mayor's Court. The cost of hiring a Magistrate would be between \$1,500 and \$2,500 per year. Also a software program would need to be purchased for a price of \$1,600 and the annual support fees would be \$300. Chief Stant reported that the number of traffic tickets filed over the past four years and the monies received from the County for these fines, it would be cost prohibitive to establish a Mayor's Court at this time.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Painter, seconded by Mr. Hall. Voting: All Yea.
