I have not spoken with anyone involved or received any comments from anyone regarding the letter the council sent after the last meeting regarding the CR-5 project.

OTHER:

PLAYGROUND REPAIRS:

We received a letter in the mail yesterday from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources giving us the official approval to begin the playground project. I contacted Pandora Contracting and told them of the official approval so it can be put on their schedule. As mentioned previously we have approval from the NatureWorks Local Assistance Grant Program no to exceed \$12,000.00 as long as the grant does not exceed 75% of the eligible costs.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE:

I have contacted Steffen Brothers Roofing to give us a quote on a standing seam roof on the maintenance building. At the time of this writing, I have not received it yet.

SHERIFF SALE:

According to the Putnam County Sheriff's web site, the Peth Sheriff Sale will be held March 26th at 10:00 am.

DAN MILLER HOUSE:

I received another complaint from Paul Quint regarding Dan Millers house at 210 Washington St. He has a lot of garbage bags setting outside again. I sent Dan a letter today reminding him of the town wide pick up next Friday. Mr. Quint also complained to Scott Stant this morning as well. The property was sold at a Sheriff sale held March 5th and was purchased by the financial institution involved; Citimortgage Inc. for \$27,000, so I don't know if they will continue to let him live there or not.

FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT PROGRAM:

The elevation certificate form on the Scott and Lisa Gratz property has been corrected regarding the "typo" as presented at the last meeting. The base flood elevation is 770.0 and Scott and Lisa's property is above that elevation except for the basement which is 765.04. The basement also has a furnace located in it which raises a red flag. However the Lowest adjacent grade next to the building is 771.79.

Ben Kelley from the ODNR Floodplain Management Program told me that we would still need a letter of map amendment (LOMA) filed with FEMA requesting the structure be removed from the 100 year flood zone. Both Greg Bockrath and Ben Kelley told me that it appears that the Gratz residence meets the criteria to be removed from the flood zone via LOMA.

In previous correspondence with Greg Bockrath, he said his fee for preparing a structure only LOMA is \$500. He stated in that email that he noticed several other structures in the area that appeared to be in the 100 year flood zone. In some past projects he has had several property owners with flood zone issues needing LOMA's to go together and do all of them at the same time resulting in each property owner saving about 20% off his typical surveying fee for LOMA preparation.

However the only one needed to take care of the violation of building in a flood zone is the Gratz property.

If you go to www.putnamcountygis.com and zoom into the area you want and turn on the FEMA Flood Zone Layer on the left side you can see the properties. It is a little tricky to navigate as you have to keep turning on and off the flood zone button as it hides the houses. What this means is if the flood zone touches any house and it is sold or refinanced, the property owner will need to purchase flood insurance unless it is removed from the flood zone. I am not sure if any of these homes would qualify except for the Gratz property, even my house where the flood zone goes one-half way through it. The list of properties I found were the following: 211 Heather Lane (David Heineman), 209 Heather Lane (Robert Lee), 207 Heather Lane (Jon Diller), 804 S. Jefferson St. (Amy Disillvestri), 806 S. PUBLISHING'S OHIO BASIC CODE 2012 EDITION, AS THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR

Kelly Ward, Putnam County Library Director, was present to update the Council on the various programs and media in the Pandora-Riley Township Branch Library as well as the circulation for the year 2011. Ms. Ward also stated several items to be purchased for the branch library for the 2012 year as well as re-painting the library. She asked the Council as to a new book drop, which would be self-standing and would be mounted on the sidewalk outside the library entrance. It was the consensus of the Council to approve the new book drop to be installed outside the entrance and mounted to the sidewalk.

Ronald Schwab was present to discuss the proposed installation of a fence by the backstop area of the old high school ball field as well as replacing another area of the fence. Mr. Schwab is to obtain a quote as to the cost for this fence and submit the same to the Council.

The Village Administrator reported on the following: 1) Received quotes from Bo-Dec as to roof replacement as well as gutter replacement of the maintenance building on Basinger Road. Mr. Schneck is also obtaining a quote from Terry Steffen as to a standing seam type roof for said building. 2) Received elevation certificate as to the Scott Gratz property being in the flood plain. There were several questions as to the elevations stated in the certificate; therefore Mr. Schneck will contact Surveyor, Greg Bockrath for clarification. 3) A letter addressed to the Ohio Department of Transportation office in Lima regarding the Road 5 project was presented to Council for their signatures. This letter expresses the Village Council's safety concerns as to the intersection of Road 5 and State Route 12. This letter also states a possible alternate route to State Route 12 just east of the present intersection. This letter will be mailed to ODOT on Wednesday.
