The Pandora Village Council met in Regular Session on Tuesday, February 23, 2021 at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building with Mayor, Jeremy Liechty, presiding.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Eisenbach, to approve the February 9, 2021 minutes. Voting: All Yea.

Resident, Ms. Nancy Hovest, was present to discuss with Council her plan for purchasing two empty downtown buildings and two empty lots along the alley. Ms. Hovest, Ms. Dawn Nelson and other investors want to renovate one of the buildings into four apartments and a small office for the business of wedding planning and event decorations. Their plan for the other building is to renovate it into an Events/Convention Center. Ms. Hovest questioned Council on any available tax incentives, grants, regulations in regards to signage, lighting, parking and permits that should be considered during the renovations. Ms. Hovest will contact the Putnam County CIC as the first step and the village will assist in any way needed to help Ms. Hovest and her investors in this endeavor.

The truck is currently at Siefker Motors with the transmission removed and sent off to be rebuilt. best estimate he could give with such short notice for the repair was that it would be under \$5,000. 2) There was a water main break that was repaired at 208 South Jefferson Street. The repair required cutting into the street and curb. Employees are currently searching for another leak. 3) Yesterday well pump #3 kicked out. Mr. Karhoff determined that it was a fuse and called Global Electric to come out and run through all components to determine what could have caused
